

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Thank you to all who participated in the Walk for Life West Coast on Saturday. It is an important witness that as Christian disciples, we stand in solidarity for and with the most vulnerable of the human family and offer our support to those in difficult circumstances. If you know a mother or family who is overwhelmed, experiencing fear, or feeling alone because of a pregnancy, you may reach out to the Gabriel Project in the Archdiocese for help and support. Likewise, the Archdiocese sponsors Rachel's Vineyard, a ministry for women and men whose lives have been touched by abortion and who seek healing, peace, and reconciliation. As has been announced in the bulletin, we are coming to the end of our transition period for online giving. Beginning in February, there will be just a single website for both churches for online giving. As noted, parishioners who have signed up for offertory envelopes will continue to receive envelopes and we will continue to take up the offertory at Mass as usual. Online giving is an additional option for people to give, especially for visitors and people from out of town.

Speaking of envelopes, your next package of envelopes from Our Sunday Visitor should have arrived or will be arriving soon. You may notice that there are fewer envelopes for the collections. This is because I exercised the line-item veto and eliminated most of our parish second collections (e.g. parish maintenance). Father Spyrow began eliminating some collections last year and I am continuing the process because it is all too apparent that we have too many second collections. Second collections are supposed to be collections when we pass the basket around a second time for a special cause and "dig a little deeper." Unfortunately, in many parishes what is supposed to be a special practice has become routine with practically every weekend having a second collection. We will continue to have second collections for what are known as diocesan or national collections (e.g. Retired Religious, St. Patrick's Seminary, World Missions). These are scheduled about once a month. And we will continue our 5th Sunday collection for the parish's St. Vincent de Paul Society. We will also participate in the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal, though that will not be done as a special collection. By eliminating our parish second collections, I am asking us to focus our sacrificial giving for the parish in the first collection. This should simplify all of our lives and shorten our time at Mass(!) because the ushers will not be going through the church twice on a regular basis.

Focus for January – The Sacred Scriptures

When we come to Mass, we say prayers as we speak to God. However, an indispensable part of the Mass is the Liturgy of the Word, where we can say God speaks to us through the Sacred Scriptures. As the Church taught at the Second Vatican Council, though the Bible was written by human authors, it is God the Holy Spirit who is the true author of the texts we read, hear, and proclaim. As it is God speaking to us, when we listen or read from the Bible, we are having an encounter with God who has revealed himself to us. In this month of January, we may challenge ourselves to encounter the Lord and be In His Presence in a particular way with the Sacred Scriptures/Bible. While we hear the Scriptures every time, we go to Mass, we may look to find a deeper way to be present to him in his Word. This could be our own private reading of the Bible or perhaps even just reading ahead of time the readings for Mass. In whatever we may do, we should not allow the Bible to just be something that sits on a shelf or just another part of what happens at Mass. We may be *In His Presence* as we allow the Lord to speak to us through his Word.
