Dear brothers and sisters,

We continue our walk through the Ten Commandments with the Sixth that tells us "You shall not commit adultery." This commandment from God helps us to become pure in body, mind, heart and soul. It leads us to what we call chastity, which is the exclusion or moderation of the sexual urge, depending on one's state in life. For the unmarried, chastity requires us to abstain from engaging in sexual thoughts or actions. For those who are lawfully married in the Church, chastity allows a couple to engage with proper moderation. Our sexuality is good when used as God has designed it.

To avoid adultery, we must be pure in both what we think and in what we say as well. To entertain lustful thoughts or to speak with crude language soils our souls. We are called to be a people who exhibit to the world purity in all that we are and in all that we do.

This is a challenge to us, as we have inherited a fallen human nature, prone to sin. We must be on our guard against such temptations. Some good practices to help us avoid the sins adultery are 1) having custody of our eyes, not gazing on inappropriate images or looking lustful at others, 2) avoiding the near occasion of sin, those persons, places or things where temptation is likely to come from, and 3) praying, both at the start of each day to be protected and whenever we are being tempted.

Let us put our trust in God, who will help us gain the victory by his grace.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The four pillars of parish stewardship are hospitality, prayer, formation, and service. Today's readings show us the immense value of prayer and the privileged place it must have in our individual lives and in our parish community.

In the Gospel passage from Luke, our Lord Himself calls us to prayer and persistence in prayer. Jesus tells the parable of the nagging widow who finally wears down the judge with her unrelenting persistence in her pursuit of a just ruling from him on her behalf. Jesus goes to great lengths to describe this judge, saying he "neither feared God nor respected any human." Yet even this corrupt judge responds with a just judgment because of the widow's persistence.

Jesus uses this example to draw a vivid contrast between a reluctant, dishonest judge and our loving, all-merciful Father. If even a bad judge will give a good result in response to a persistent request, how much more (infinitely more) eagerly and perfectly will our good Father respond to our persistent prayers to Him.

If he delays in responding, if he provides a different response from the one we were expecting, we can remain confident and trusting in His goodness, knowing that His response, whenever it comes and in whatever form, will be the very best one for us.

Our job then, as Christians, is simply to remain faithful to our relationship with God through prayer. We must lean on each other in our communities, families, and parish, and support each other in prayer. A strong pillar of prayer will make all our other efforts fruitful.

Respect for Life Prayer


O God, our eyes behold the beauty of your creation, and our ears catch the sounds of your power.
