

Dear brothers and sisters,

We continue our new series on virtue today with the human virtue of prudence. Prudence helps us in making wise decisions. It considers the context, circumstances, and possible outcomes of a decision being made. A prudent person seeks the counsel of others who they recognize as wise. Prudence requires the application of principles and values when figuring out what to do. For example, a person whose principles tell them that stealing is wrong will more easily decide not to take what is not theirs.

How do we strengthen the virtue of prudence within us? First and foremost, we will need our mind, our thinking, to be enlightened by Godly principles. Reading and reflecting on the Scriptures does an excellent job of this. If you haven't already, I strongly encourage you to read the Wisdom Books: Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom, and Sirach. Here we learn the difference between right and wrong from the perspective of God. With these teachings as our foundation, we will make wiser and even holier decisions.

Secondly, we should also seek the guidance of others, as I mentioned above. We can ask the input of wise people we know, people who we see living a good life pleasing to God. They have much to teach us. The Church itself is also somewhere we can go to. Her teachings, built upon the Gospel of Jesus Christ, will not only bless us in this life, but can lead us into heaven. Reading the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the summary of all we believe, will grant us such heavenly guidance.

May we seek to grow in prudence, that our choices might produce goodness in us and in our world, which is beset by so much confusion and uncertainty.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

When Pope Francis visited the United States for the purpose of supporting and building up the family, his message was a reminder of God's beautiful plan for humankind: "The humanism of the Bible presents this icon: the human couple, united and fruitful, placed by God in the garden of world, to cultivate it and to guard it." Scripture reveals that the family in fact represents most completely the image of God. Moreover, the image of a God who has revealed Himself to be a communion of Persons of life-giving love. Even though it was Jesus who revealed God's Trinitarian nature, we can see the Trinity already foreshadowed in the Old Testament. The first instance being when God created humans in His own image.

God, who is One, referred to Himself as "us" and created two persons, distinct yet one to be His image. The unity of man and woman as the image of God is again affirmed in our First Reading when man is not complete without the creation of woman. Woman is created from man's side, showing that though she is different than man, she is also of the same nature and of equal dignity.

Because the family is the icon of the Trinity and therefore of God Himself, it makes sense that it has suffered the most from Satan's attacks and from the effects of original sin. The unity between man and woman has been harmed and the joy of openness to life undermined. Sometimes we can feel a distance from our creative nature, that it seems like God's revelation about ourselves in Genesis is just a dream. Rather than unity, we more often see power struggles, selfishness, adultery, use and abuse, and so on.

In today's Gospel, Jesus juxtaposes the two possible views toward marriage: a skepticism based on the reality of sin, or a hopefulness based on the reality of redemption. Jesus has not given up on marriage and the family, He has come to redeem it. It is the very image of our Trinitarian God. ~ Angela Jendro

to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament



For you are God, forever and ever.


