

There is a tradition that before the Mass during the Night of Christmas, the Church chants a proclamation of the birth of Jesus Christ from a book call the *Roman Martyrology*. It is a text that situates the birth of our Lord in the context of sacred and secular history. May it be a reminder for us that God is truly in our lives and world today.

The Twenty-fifth Day of December, / when ages beyond number had run their course / from the creation of the world, / when God in the beginning created heaven and earth, / and formed man in his own likeness; / when century upon century had passed / since the Almighty set his bow in the clouds after the Great Flood, / as a sign of covenant and peace; / in the twenty-first century since Abraham, our father in faith, / came out of Ur of the Chaldees; / in the thirteenth century since the People of Israel were led by Moses / in the Exodus from Egypt; / around the thousandth year since David was anointed King; / in the sixty-fifth week of the prophecy of Daniel; / in the one hundred and ninety-fourth Olympiad; / in the year seven hundred and fifty-two / since the foundation of the City of Rome; / in the forty-second year of the reign of Caesar Octavian Augustus, / the whole world being at peace, / JESUS CHRIST, eternal God and Son of the eternal Father, / desiring to consecrate the world by his most loving presence, / was conceived by the Holy Spirit, / and when nine months had passed since his conception, / was born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem of Judah, / and was made man: / The Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to the flesh. #### **Parish Advent Charity Projects**

In looking for a charitable parish project for the season of Advent, our parish council decided to offer support to the Opiate Treatment Outpatient Program Methadone Clinic at SF General which provides detoxification assistance to clients in conjunction with medical and psychiatric services. Since many of their clients are the homeless and poor, our projects will help to provide the clinic staff with items they will be able to distribute to clients as they come in for medical treatment. We will have three opportunities to do this:

#1 Sandwiches – Thank you to all who made PB&J sandwiches!

**#2 Giving Trees** – We are collecting new adult gloves, beanies, and blankets (e.g. fleece) which the staff at the clinic will be able to distribute to their clients as they come in for treatment during the colder months of the year. Please take an ornament from the tree that lists the needed item and return the item to either church (unwrapped) by Sunday, December 31.

**#3 Cookies for Christmas** – Thank you to our bakers for your donation of cookies for the staff at San Francisco General to distribute to patients on Christmas Day!

If you are able to participate in the projects, your generosity will provide warmth, nourishment, and the sweetness of the season to those in our community who need it most. Let's make this Advent season a time of giving and compassion.
