

First Sunday of Advent - December 3, 2023

The season of Advent is upon us! While decorations around the City and the world tend to be already wishing us a merry Christmas, as if the birth of the Christ child has already happened, I encourage all of us enter the sacred season of Advent with a focus on waiting. Waiting for His birth, waiting to celebrate God's presence among us. None of us likes to wait, especially in a culture that can have things right away. (...hold on, my Amazon package just arrived...) Waiting can help us slow down and refocus ourselves. It helps us to recall why the celebration of Christmas is so important and why we celebrate Christmas at all. In the coming days and weeks, we will have various opportunities to celebrate, pray, and serve, and all in view of waiting for what is to come – the Light of the World who will be entering our lives. May this time of Advent, be a sacred time of waiting and anticipation for you and your families.

Reflections on the Mass and Sacred Liturgy The Season of Advent - December 3rd - December 24th

The season of Advent begins on the First Sunday of Advent and continues until Christmas. This season has a two-fold character. First of all, it is a time when we focus on waiting in joyful expectation for the second coming of the Lord at the end of time. For that reason, on the First Sunday of Advent, we hear in the gospels of the three-year cycle about staying awake for the coming of the Son of Man, about being watchful and alert since we do not know when he will come, and about the Son of Man coming with power and glory.

As Advent progresses, however, the first coming of Christ becomes more prominent. He is the Son of God and the Son of Mary as well as the baby born in Bethlehem who will suffer, die, and rise again for our salvation. The Second Sunday of Advent, therefore, has John the Baptist crying out: Prepare the way of the Lord. The Third Sunday of Advent again features John the Baptist hearing about the miracles of Christ, instructing the people that there is one among them whose sandal strap he is not worthy to untie, and then teaching that there is someone mightier than he who is coming and who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Then, at last, on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we hear in the Gospel of how the birth of Jesus Christ came about, of Mary saying to the Archangel Gabriel: Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord, and the exclamation of Elizabeth at the visitation: How is it that the mother of my Lord should come to me?

Parish Advent Charity Projects

In looking for a charitable parish project for the season of Advent, our parish council decided to offer support to the Opiate Treatment Outpatient Program Methadone Clinic at SF General which provides detoxification assistance to clients in conjunction with medical and psychiatric services. Since many of their clients are homeless and poor, our projects will help to provide the clinic staff with items they will be able to distribute to clients as they come in for medical treatment. We will have three opportunities to do this:

#1 Sandwiches – TODAY, Sunday, December 3 after both the 9:00 AM Mass at St. Thomas and the 11:00 AM Mass at St. Monica's, please join us in making sandwiches that the clinic staff will distribute to hungry clinic clients. Our goal is to make 300 peanut butter sandwiches that weekend.

#2 Giving Trees – We will once again be establishing our Advent Giving Trees at both Churches. We will collect new adult gloves, beanies, and blankets (e.g. fleece) which the staff at the clinic will be able to distribute to their clients as they come in for treatment during the colder months of the year. Please take an ornament from the tree that lists the needed item and return the item to either church (unwrapped) by Sunday, December 24.
#3 Cookies for Christmas – We will have the opportunity to bake cookies for the staff to distribute to clients. More details to come later in December.

If you are able to participate in the projects, your generosity will provide warmth, nourishment, and the sweetness of the season to those in our community who need it most. Let's make this Advent season a time of giving and compassion. Thank you for your support!


