

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last week, I briefly wrote about the penitential practice of Prayer that we do during the season of

Lent. This week, I would like to turn our attention to the practice of Fasting. Fasting is our choice to do without something. It is a mark of being human as we can choose to do without something over and above what our feelings and desires want. For example, even though I am hungry, I can still choose not to eat. Often, we associate fasting with food, but we can fast from other things like watching television or using social media. Fasting should not be something that hurts us but serve as a reminder and challenge that God gives us power and freedom over our bodies and that we are in control of our decisions and not simply a prisoner to our own desires.

This weekend, I introduce to our parish Mr. Xristopher Compagno. Xristopher is in the last year and a half of the permanent diaconate formation program of the Archdiocese and will be assigned to our parish for the final part of his formation. He is a parishioner of Saint Dominic's, but as is the case from time to time, candidates are assigned to other parishes when there are already multiple deacons at a parish, as is the case with St. Dominic's. He will be giving us a brief biography so as to learn about his background. You will see him serve the community at both St. Thomasand St. Monica in a direct way by assisting as an altar server (acolyte) and giving occasional reflections at the daily Masses. The initial plan is also for him to be involved with Deacon Dana and the ministry to the homebound. We are grateful for the continued ministry of Deacon Dana (who is not being replaced) and for the faithful service of Deacon Peter.

Once again, I want to encourage and remind you that next Sunday, as part of the Eucharistic Revival in the Archdiocese, Dr. Scott French will make a presentation on the Modern-Day Eucharistic Miracles which touch upon the intersection of faith and science. It will begin around noon on Sunday, March 3, after the 11:00 AM Mass at St. Monica's. There will be a complimentary catered lunch included as part of the program to encourage attendance by the community. You may just come to the luncheon and presentation if you attend a different Mass that weekend and the event is *gratis*.

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINECE

As in the past, the following regulations are in place for abstaining and fasting during Lent:

- **ABSTINENCE**: Everyone 14 years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- **FAST**: Everyone 18 years of age and older but under the age of 60 is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.
