Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today (Sunday) is Saint Patrick's Day, the co-patron saint of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, the patron saint of Nigeria (the homeland of Father Paulinus Iwuji who is in residence at Saint Monica's), and of course the holy land, that is, Ireland. Because his feast day falls on a Sunday of Lent this year, the feast day is transferred to Monday so we will ask for his intercession in a special way tomorrow, March 18th.

Speaking of patron saints, Tuesday (March 19th) is the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Virgin Mary and Patron of the Universal Church. In addition to the Universal Church, Saint Joseph is the patron saint of the Diocese of San Jose, so we pray for Msgr. Terry Sullivan who is a retired priest of the Diocese of San Jose currently residing in his family home in the Outer Richmond and who often joins us for Mass at St. Thomas the Apostle.

Tuesday is also the feast day of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet. We give thanks for the presence of the Sisters who live in our parish: Sister Loraine, Sister Theresa, and especially our Director of Religious Education and Pastoral Associate, Sister Noreen. Sister Noreen is down in Los Angeles this week spending time at the Motherhouse as they celebrate their patron because this year is her 70th Anniversary of entry into religious life, and they have a special recognition for their jubilarians. As you may have seen in the bulletin, our parish will have a special celebration to honor her on April 21. A committee is hard at work with the event planning and there will soon be a sign-up for those who desire to attend the luncheon.

Thank you to all who have made flower offerings for Easter. We will continue to collect them throughout this month. You may put the envelopes in the first collection or drop them off in the parish office. A reminder that you may write the names of loved ones on the envelopes, and just like for All Souls Day, we will put those names on our altars at Easter.

Focus for March - Suffering and Pain

At one time or another, all of us are hurt. We may fall down, get sick, have a medical procedure, be afflicted by a chronic illness that affects the body and/or mind, or someone we know is sick and our pain comes from watching him or her suffer. Suffering is a difficult part of being human to. It is also a perennial question that we often ask of our world, "Why is there suffering? Why does God allow suffering? How can there be suffering and a loving God?" Questions like these are particularly appropriate in Lent as suffering and pain is a theme that appears in various ways. Just think about how Lent began with Jesus in the desert fasting for 40 days. He was hungry during his fast and that meant he experienced pain. Then of course as we close in on Easter, there will be Holy Week when we read about his Passion and Death. He experienced the mental anguish of his suffering as well as the physical reality of being tortured, and of course death. This season of Lent may help us to see that when you and I suffer or are in pain, we do not do so alone. Jesus suffers along with us as we face our own trials. That makes the individual experiences and lives of Jesus and us close to one another, and as such, we may say we are In His Presence when we find ourselves suffering.

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE

As in the past, the following regulations are in place for abstaining and fasting during Lent:

- **ABSTINENCE**: Everyone 14 years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- **FAST**: Everyone 18 years of age and older but under the age of 60 is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.


