Dear brothers and sisters,

As you may know, this time of Lent, is a time of walking with Jesus as he carries his cross for us. It is a time of penance and a time to grow in our holy Faith, a Faith that unites us to the Lord.

Each Lent, we are to embrace the Lenten practices of the Church. These are three practices: Fasting, Almsgiving, and Prayer. Let us consider each one of these holy practices today and in the weeks ahead. They are good for our souls and they lead us to new life in Christ.

First of all we practice fasting. This is simply the denying ourselves of the good things of this world, that we might better appreciate the blessing of spiritual goods. We can fast from certain foods, for example luxurious foods, and eat more simply. That way we can save up something to give to the poor. We can also fast from media, entertainment, and partying (although I don't believe we are the partying type). But of course you might surprise me.

We can also say that Lent is a time to fast from sinful thoughts, words and deeds, but of course it is always the time to do that. Jesus calls us "to repent", and Lent is a proper time to turn away from all that is an obstacle to our relationship with God. The more we turn away from sin, the more we will find God present in our lives. The more we deny ourselves, the more we find him.

This Lent let us walk this path courageously, willing to make sacrifices for Christ and with Christ. May our souls rise up from the earth to the things of Heaven.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's Gospel passage reminds us that life is precious and the gift of time on this earth is just that, a gift. None of us knows how much time will be granted to us, so we must use this gift intentionally to glorify God and serve our neighbor. Jesus offers the parable of the fig tree to further illustrate this truth. The owner of the orchard came searching for fruit on a fig tree he had planted in his orchard. Finding no fruit on the tree after three years, he told the gardener to cut it down.



But the gardener intercedes and asks for one more year to cultivate and fertilize the tree in hopes it would bear fruit in the future. The fig tree was not dying; it simply wasn't doing much of anything at all. Can this be said of us and our lives as well?

The season of Lent is a time to carefully reflect on the way we spend our time. Do we make God our first priority, tending to our spiritual growth and sacramental life with diligence? Do we give the next priority to our loved ones, focusing intentionally on them each day without distractions from phones, screens, or thoughts of work? If not, now is the moment to repent of our waste of time or of misplaced priorities on our use of time. God is merciful but just. Let's turn to Him and ask Him to make our lives fruitful while we still have time to do so. ©Catholic Stewardship Consultants

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE

As in the past, the following regulations are in place for abstaining and fasting during Lent:

- **ABSTINENCE**: Everyone 14 years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.
- FAST: Everyone 18 years of age and older but under the age of 60 is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.
