Dear Sisters and Brothers,

To round out the traditional Lenten penitential practices, I will mention a brief word on Almsgiving/Good Works. In giving Alms, we are looking to detach ourselves from possessions of the world. Normally, we think of giving Alms in terms of money, which we use to acquire possessions. When we give Alms, we are parting with things that we may say, at least symbolically if not sometimes literally, we rely upon for support. To give Alms to the poor teaches and reminds us that our support and sustenance does not come from the things we possess but ultimately from the Lord. By giving Alms, we are parting with something and looking to God who assists us in our need. In a similar way, Good Works are a way of giving what is often the most precious thing we "possess," our time. During the Lenten season, I hope that by taking up one or more of the practices of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving/Good Works, will allow us to keep our eyes fixed in a more intentional way on the Lord as we journey with him to his Cross and Resurrection.

A big thank you to all of our parishioners who made the celebration of the Lunar New Year (Têt) with the Vietnamese community such a wonderful celebration of faith and culture last weekend. The diversity of our parish is also an example of the catholicity, or universality, of our Catholic faith.

Finally, this coming weekend, a group of young people from our parish will celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. Please pray for them as they get to celebrate a Sacrament and receive our Heavenly Father's merciful and abundant grace as they strive to grow in holiness. Their celebration of the sacrament also serves as a reminder to us that during this time of Lent, we are encouraged to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation ourselves as apart of making a return to the Lord.

In His Presence The Eucharistic Revival at St. Monica – St. Thomas the Apostle Focus for March - Suffering and Pain

At one time or another, all of us are hurt. We may fall down, get sick, have a medical procedure, be afflicted by a chronic illness that affects the body and/or mind, or someone we know is sick and our pain comes from watching him or her suffer. Suffering is a difficult part of being human to. It is also a perennial question that we often ask of our world, "Why is there suffering? Why does God allow suffering? How can there be suffering and a loving God?" Questions like these are particularly appropriate in Lent as suffering and pain is a theme that appears in various ways. Just think about how Lent began with Jesus in the desert fasting for 40 days. He was hungry during his fast and that meant he experienced pain. Then of course as we close in on Easter, there will be Holy Week when we read about his Passion and Death. He experienced the mental anguish of his suffering as well as the physical reality of being tortured, and of course death. This season of Lent may help us to see that when you and I suffer or are in pain, we do not do so alone. Jesus suffers along with us as we face our own trials. That makes the individual experiences and lives of Jesus and us close to one another, and as such, we may say we are In His Presence when we find ourselves suffering.








SOUP SUPPER & STATIONS OF THE CROSS

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE

As in the past, the following regulations are in place for abstaining and fasting during Lent:

- **ABSTINENCE**: Everyone 14 years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- **FAST**: Everyone 18 years of age and older but under the age of 60 is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.
