






# WALK WITH JESUS ACROSS THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE! SUNDAY, MAY 19, 2024

Join Archbishop Cordileone and the Eucharistic Perpetual Pilgrims for the launch of the National Eucharistic Revival Pilgrimage from the West on the St. Junipero Serra Route. The event begins with an 11:00 am Mass at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption followed by a pilgrimage walk with the Blessed Sacrament across the Golden Gate

Bridge.

This route is named after the "Apostle of California," St. Junipero Serra, a missionary priest who dedicated his life to administering the sacraments to indigenous people and Spanish settlers across the west coast of our continent. He traveled approximately 24,000 miles throughout his ministry, mostly on foot. Join us in asking for his intercession as we respond to the Holy Spirit's invitation to revival.

St. Junipero Serra, pray for us!

Shortly after his Resurrection, Jesus accompanied two disciples on their journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus-walking with them in their grief, offering hope, and finally revealing himself through the breaking of the bread. Jesus wants to do the same for YOU!

This will be one of the largest Eucharistic pilgrimages in history. Just as crowds followed Christ throughout his earthly ministry, our nation will process with our Eucharistic Lord through cities, along highways, and past rural towns on his way to the 10th National Eucharistic Congress.
