Dear brothers and sisters,

In our reflection on the three Lenten Disciplines, today we consider prayer.

The best definition I have hear of prayer is "a heart to heart conversation with God." It is the sharing of our very self with God: our hopes, our dreams, our concerns, our needs, our thanks, our love. The more we practice prayer, the closer we draw to God, since it brings us into a relationship with him. He waits for us to speak with him, patiently longing for our friendship. Some Lenten prayer practices we can do to improve our prayer to the Lord are first and foremost our regular daily prayers, both morning and evening, and in between. Stations of the Cross are an excellent way to be reminded of the suffering our Lord endured for us. We might also consider coming to Mass more often than just Sundays, as we have the Holy Mass available everyday. When we pray the Mass, we are praying the most powerful prayer that exists. In it, Jesus' very sacrifice is made present, and his gift of himself is wonderfully received.

Let us raise our hearts and minds to God in prayer. If we do, our lives will be empowered, transformed by the One who is with us, the God who seeks for us. May he find us near to him!

Fifth Sunday of Lent ~ April 6, 2025



Once again, this week, we are reminded of what a loving and merciful God we serve. The theme of the readings for this Fifth Sunday of Lent are summed up beautifully in today's Gospel passage from Luke, which recounts the story of the woman caught in adultery. After all those who would have stoned this woman leave the scene, Christ says to her, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."

When we turn to God for forgiveness, He is indeed gracious and merciful. So much so, that not only will He forgive our sins without condemnation, but He will also make us completely new creations in Christ.

What is more amazing is that this all-perfect and holy God of ours draws so very near to us. Our sins do not drive Him from us, but rather to us so that He can set us free from our sins. Look carefully at Christ's actions and posture in the Gospel reading as He deals with the crowd of people, the Scribes and Pharisees, and the adulterous woman. "All the people started coming to Him and he sat down and taught them." "He bent down and began to write with His finger." He "straightened up" when He confronted the Scribes and Pharisees about their own sins. And he "straightened up" when He assured the woman that He did not condemn her for her past. Like a skilled teacher, or loving "big brother," Christ bends down to where we are, He sits among us, He stands to confront us when needed and He stands to look us in the eye to remind us of our true dignity.

We're all unworthy of the great privilege of serving Him. But that, quite simply, is cause for greater joy in serving Him with all our hearts.
