Dear Sisters and Brothers,


Tomorrow, we celebrate Memorial Day as we pray for and remember those men and women of the military who died in service of our country. During my studies and priestly ministry in Europe, I had the privilege to visit two particular American Cemeteries, one in Nettuno outside of Rome, Italy and the other in Normandy, France. Both of these cemeteries are the resting place of Americans who died in the liberation of Europe during the Second World War. In Italy, for the Liberation of Sicily and Rome, and then in Normandy from the D-Day Invasion and the subsequent Liberation of France. If you have ever been to a national cemetery like in Colma or Arlington, you will find them to be sacred and somber places. A military mom told me years ago that if someone wanted to understand sacrifice, people could look to military

families. This was from the point of view of not just those who make the ultimate sacrifice with their lives, but the day to day sacrifices they make as families. Let us remember in our prayers on Memorial Day all of those who have gone before us and give thanks for their sacrifices which they make for all of us.

This coming week, we will say goodbye to our 8th Graders who are graduating from Saint Monica School. I plan to write more about them next week, but we wish to keep them in our prayers as they being this exciting transition to high school.

I am away this weekend but plan to see you all next weekend.


