

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last Thursday, our school year concluded for our grade school of Saint Monica's. The end of the school year is always an exciting and joyful time for all students as they move into the summer months. As the year ends, I grateful for the leadership of our parish educational ministries: Vince Sweeters, Principal of St. Monica's School; Jessie Men, Director of the St. Thomas the Apostle Preschool; and Sister Noreen O'Connor, Director of our Parish Faith Formation Program; and all of our faculty, staff, and faith formation teachers who work tirelessly to help form all of our young people throughout the school year.

Also as we enter summer, a word of thanks to all of our students who participated in our altar server program throughout the year. It has been a great gift to have them participate and serve at our liturgies once again. I hope that after this first year of restarting the program, we will have many more students interested in serving at Mass when school starts in the fall.

This coming Saturday, we will have our Presbyteral ordination at Saint Mary's Cathedral for the Archdiocese of San Francisco. Deacon David Mees, who is from our neighboring parish of Star of the Sea Church, will be ordained a priest and assigned to Saint Catherine's in Burlingame. It is a joyous occasion and an opportunity for us to remember to pray Father Mees and for future vocations to the priesthood and consecrated religious life from and for our Archdiocese.

As we enter the summer months, I want you to be aware of some planned work on the blacktop areas of both of our campuses. Several years ago, Father Sakowski and our two schools worked to apply for a grant project funded by the SFPUC. The project and grants involve building out some extra space on the blacktop areas where water can flow into the ground when it rains and include plants and landscaping in those drainage areas. St. Anne of the Sunset Church completed the project last year so if you happen to be over there, you can see a sample of what they do. For our campuses, the space that will be used is directed towards the edges of some of our blacktop areas and should not take out much parking. At St. Monica's this will be in both the lower and upper yards. St. Monica School will also be improving the area on the lower yard along 24th Ave. for basketball which was part of their school auction fundraising this year. This project has taken some time because the builders trouble with permitting and then the timing had to be coordinated with the schools so it would not happen during the school year. Things are finally looking like they will be moving forward so likely starting the week of June 17, we will have some construction happening in our parking lot areas. Please be careful of the areas where they are working but note access to the parking lot areas should not be impeded. When it is all done, it will be an improvement for both of our campuses, both ascetically and environmentally.








Congratulations to Rev. Terry Sullivan who is celebrating his 60th year

In His Presence The Eucharistic Revival at St. Monica – St. Thomas the Apostle

Focus for June – Being in God's Presence in the Eucharist


Throughout the year of our Eucharistic Revival, we have been pondering various ways we are in the Lord's Presence, whether it be in other people, the experiences of our lives, or in the wonder of creation. For this final month, we may consider a way of the Lord's Presence that we encounter every time we come to Mass, and that is the Lord's Presence in the Eucharistic. On the night of the Passover before he died, Jesus took the bread and wine and gave them to his disciples saying this was his Body and Blood and eat and drink this in remembrance of Him. Every time we come to Mass, we continue to do what he commanded us to do in remembrance of Him. In this our Eucharistic gathering, we enter into His Presence in a very particular way that does not come from natural relationships like with other people or our natural world, but from a supernatural outpouring of God's power into our lives. To behold the Lamb of God, as the priest says at Mass, and to eat and drink the Body and Blood of Christ when we receive the Eucharistic, is to share in the very life of God. We use the term Real Presence for the Eucharist because through faith, we believe God is with us in a very real way, the same as sitting next to another person. This is not something we decided would happen, but something the Son of God told us would happen. From the very first days after Jesus Christ's rising from the dead, the community of disciples gathered together and broke bread in remembrance of him. We continue to gather even to this day because we desire to be In His Presence when we share in the gift of the Eucharist.


