
Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Let us continue to delve into what it means to be initiated into the Christian life. I mentioned last week that there are three Sacraments which grant us the grace to live our faith in its fullness. These are Baptism, The Eucharist, and Confirmation. These three should be received by everyone who professes to be a Catholic Christian.

Let us today look at what it means to be baptized. Baptism is the first Sacrament that we must receive. Through it several things take place: 1) We are set free from the dominion of Original Sin, 2) We become children of God, able to worship God, and call upon Him as Father, 3) We are made members of the Church, gaining access to all of the Church's graces, and 4) We become brothers and sisters of one another, through the Sonship of Jesus, the only begotten Son of God.

Baptism is therefore a pivotal grace, so much depends upon it. This is why it is important for us to renew our baptism from time to time, renew our commitment to live as children of God. Each year at Easter, many parishes do indeed renew this commitment. We don't have to wait until then. Each day we can pray "Lord, I renew my commitment to you. I choose to live my baptism. I desire to be yours, to serve you, to be your very child." If we do this, then the grace of baptism can come alive within us. How blessed we are to belong to God in such a way!

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Our readings today continue to educate us on the Eucharist.



Jesus tells us in our Gospel that He is this Food that sustains us as He says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven...and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." This bread He is referring to is His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity that we receive. This bread becomes the flesh of Christ Himself. Let us approach the Lord acknowledging His Divine Presence and be open to all the graces He desires to pour out on us. Then we must go forth, being attentive to the moments that the Holy Spirit is calling us to act as He acts — in total love and sacrifice.

The Eucharist affects our lives more than we can comprehend. We are receiving God Himself. Let us strive to receive Him reverently and with open hearts.
