Dear brothers and sisters,

As we continue our reflections on the various forms of prayer and their effectiveness, we consider prayers of contrition. This is the prayer of asking God for forgiveness for our sins and failures to love.

As the saying goes, "to err is human, to forgive is divine." These two statements couldn't be truer. As fallen human beings, we tend to act from our weaknesses. Our hearts can be quite rebellious; you can ask any parent with children going through "the terrible twos." Thankfully, God is loving and merciful, ready to forgive us when we turn our hearts back to him. We do need to ask for his mercy; it cannot just be assumed.

When we offer up prayers of contrition for sins, we experience how compassionate God truly is. We must discover this about the Lord. We are meant to experience the depths of his love, and when he forgives us, it is made apparent to us. After all, we don't deserve forgiveness, but he grants it out of the depths of his heart for us, his wayward children. His mercy is truly divine.

Let us then practice contrition in our daily prayer. We might consider examining our day each night and praying for the act of contrition (which we should all have memorized). We can also come to the Sacrament of Mercy itself, Confession, also called Reconciliation, as it reconciles us with our Heavenly Father in a powerful way. As we ask for forgiveness, we will find restoration, healing, and the grace to start again anew, which God is always wanting and waiting to give us.

Spoiler alert: turns out Christian stewards are not the fools!


In this passage, Jesus makes it clear that life is not about "stuff" as he tells the parable of the wealthy businessman who thought he had everything figured out. The man had such an abundance of stuff that he didn't have room to store it all. So, thinking of earthly things and not on what is above, he decided to build a bigger place to store all that stuff. Patting himself on the back, he thought about what good times he would have in the years ahead. But Jesus tells us that day would turn out to be the man's last day on the earth. And he had spent it thinking only of himself. How foolish!

Don't be ashamed of living differently from the people around you. Be confident as you set priorities based on what is above. You are wise in God's eyes. And you will be rich in what matters most.
