Dear brothers and sisters,

Happy Feast Day of St. Monica to you! We give thanks today for one of our Parish's Patron Saints, one of God's holy ones who helps guide us along the journey back to him.

Over the course of my first year with you, I have often reflected on St. Monica and her life. One of the things that strikes me most about her is how she prayed and prayed for her family to be converted. She prayed, fasted, and shed many tears. This alone is a wonderful inspiration for us. After all, we too have many people in our lives whom we love who are distant from the Lord. St. Monica shows us how to respond: by storming heaven on their behalf.

And we see the fruit of her works, answered prayers. God heard her cry, and he came to her aid. Not only were her husband and son converted, but in a very powerful way. Her husband turned to the Lord in his last days of life, and her son became one of the Church's greatest saints. St. Augustine is considered by many the premier doctor of the Church, a teacher of the Faith that we hold dear. He is also considered the first to write an autobiography, "The Confessions." We learn quite a bit about St. Monica in it.

My friends, on this feast day, may we hold fast to the same hope of St. Monica. May we believe that God hears us, especially when it comes to praying for our families. The Lord loves them even more than we do. May we persevere in prayer with longing in our hearts for them. May St. Monica help us as well, that with her we will have faith that "The child of such tears cannot be lost."



**St. Monica** is a patron saint for mothers and wives. She was an exemplary woman who never gave up hope and her faith in God despite all tribulations in her family life. If there are mothers out there who suffer from children going astray, here is your saint to whom you could take as a role model.

St. Monica was born in the year 332 in Tagaste, North Africa. She had a conversion experience at a very young age and lived a life of virtue. When she reached a marriageable age, her parents gave her in marriage to a non-Christian man named Patricius.

St. Monica endured all her trials with patience, gentleness, and kindness. She would pray daily for the conversion of her husband. Her strong faith and hope in God's mercy paid off. Patricius accepted his wife's faith a year before his death. He admitted that he admired his wife's strong faith, and it was her unwavering kindness towards him that changed him. St. Monica and Patricius had three children. St Augustine, being one of their children. She never gave up in her prayers for her son. She would fast, cry, and beg God for her son's conversion. Legend says that a drain formed in the ground where her tears fell while she prayed for her son. St. Monica would approach the local bishop and ask them to win her son over to the faith. The Bishop would often console her, saying, "God's time will come. Go now, it is not possible that the son of so many tears should perish". St. Monica was a mother who never gave up. Finally, the time came for St. Augustine's conversion at the age of 29. For her greatest joy, St. Augustine, not only embraced Christianity during an Easter

celebration, but he also decided to live a life of celibacy and devote himself to God's service. St. Augustine was not only a wonderful Bishop, but later became one of the greatest saints and doctors of the Catholic church. This was the culminating point of his mother's prayers being answered. At St. Monica's deathbed, she said to her son: "I do not know what there is left for me to do or why I am still here, all my hopes in this world being now fulfilled. All I wished for was that I might see you a Catholic and a child of Heaven. God granted me even more than this in making you despise earthly felicity and consecrate yourself to His service".

Saint Monica, therefore, has been honored for generations as a special patroness of married women and an example for Christian motherhood.




# PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION (CCD) FOR ST. MONICA-ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE PARISH
