Dear brothers and sisters,

Now that we have reflected on the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation, it would be good for us to also consider the other four Sacraments of the Church. Today we will take a closer look at the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also known as Confession.

Reconciliation means to return to someone we have been estranged from. We reconcile, or make up with them, restoring and strengthening our relationship. In this Sacrament, we are given the wonderful chance to be washed clean from our sins and so live in the state of grace. This is something we need to do, since we are not perfect and do sin from time to time. Sometimes our sins are light, which we call venial sin, and sometimes our sins are serious, which we call mortal sin. As Catholics, we are required to confess our mortal sins as soon as possible, especially before coming to Holy Communion, so that we can worthily receive Jesus. We are also required to confess our sins at least once a year, even if we have not sinned mortally.

Although, confessing might seem like merely following rules and regulations, there is much more to this holy Sacrament. It is the grace to be forgiven, to be set free from what burdens us, and to be made righteous in God's eyes. What a gift, what a grace from the Lord! He has poured out his life on the cross to free us from our sins. May we respond by receiving the forgiveness that he has graciously won for us.






GOSPEL REFLECTION

Everything we have is a gift from God: except sin which is all ours. Sometimes we forget that these elements of our faith are true gifts. For example, when was the last time we thanked God for the Commandments? God makes his desire for us known and he makes the path to him straight: the question is if we want to be on that path. Everything comes from heaven and we are made for heaven. So when God gives us the Commandments, these are gifts. In today's Gospel, Jesus is reminding us what a gift the Commandments are: the big "T" traditions the Church gives us versus the small "t" traditions that we take on. God reminds us that all good gifts are from God; all good gifts are designed that we will live; all good gifts are designed that we will come back to God. What turns this upside down is what comes from within us. Jesus gives us the Commandments and the Church to guard our sacred truths. The Church still hands on these statutes and decrees so that we won't die and will live.






