



Dear brothers and sisters,

Today, we reflect on the Second Commandment, "you shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain." This commandment calls us to use our words rightly, to honor God through all that we say. When the words we speak are dignified, upright, and true, then we give glory to the Lord, the one who made us. Jesus is, after all, rightly called "The Word of God."

Reverencing God with our words can be accomplished in various ways. We can use our voice to thank God, to praise him, to sing to him. We can proclaim his goodness



to others when we speak about God and his teachings. We also honor God when we use our words to speak the truth. If we make promises to others, we are to keep our word.

We are to avoid using our words vainly. This could be using God's name as a swear word, exclamation, or a response to being surprised or shocked. We should not use our words to speak poorly of anything holy: the Church, the sacraments, the saints, or anything belonging to our faith.

May we keep the Second Commandment by making good use of our voice. It is a gift from God to be able to speak. May we lift our voice on high to proclaim God's marvelous deeds, bringing great honor to the One who deserves all praise.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

After today's readings, we can't say we have not been warned about the dangers of mixed-up priorities. God's Word is so very clear today on the necessity of putting Him first in all areas of our lives. We see this in the First Reading from Amos. The Lord has harsh words for those who would take advantage of the poor and whose priorities are not aligned with God's.

In the Second Reading from St. Paul's letter to Timothy, Paul gives us the antidote to the selfcenteredness condemned in our First Reading. The antidote is to imitate Christ, "who gave Himself as a ransom for all." Rather than thinking of Himself and how to "get ahead," Christ gave Himself away, completely, for our sake. That is how we are to live.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, the Lord shows us how to bridge the gap between worldly thinking and priorities, and eternal thinking and priorities. Jesus tells the parable of the corrupt but clever steward who is about to be fired when the master discovers the steward has been squandering his property. Realizing his imminent unemployed status, the clever steward reaches out to the various debtors of his master to wheel and deal with them, making friends who would look out for him when he became jobless.

What if we put that kind of effort into our own tasks as good stewards of all God's gifts to us? Into our ministries, into the ways we could make more time for prayer as individuals, as couples, as families, and as a parish? What if we got as creative as the "bad steward" in the use of our finances so that we could give more generously to the poor and the advancement of God's kingdom on the earth? That's our lesson and our challenge.

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Catechetical Sunday is an annual Catholic observance on the third Sunday in September that recognizes and commissions catechists (those who teach the Catholic faith) and reminds all Catholics of their shared responsibility to pass on the faith.

The theme for 2025 is "Always be ready to give an explanation...for a reason for your hope" (1 Pet 3:15). The theme encourages us to be prepared to share the basis of our faith, the Lord, and the hope he provides. In the same manner, St. Peter encouraged the believers of his time. As Scripture reminds us, the sharing should be done with gentleness and respect.

Thank you to our catechists: Rev. Ben Rosado, Rev. Mr. Xristopher Compagno, Rev. Mr. Dana Perrigan, Br. Henry Bischoff MIC, Jacob McDougall, Teresa Lai, Agnes Tung, and to all those who lead those into the faith.




